In this glorious solo, the player should project the strong personality of an uninhibited virtuoso. Strive for a full and brilliant sound on all notes (including 16ths), steady rhythm and clean technical execution. Regarding the p dynamic at the beginning of the solo at \mathbf{D} , I can only say I have never been asked to play this solo with anything less than an expansive, radiant sound. If you take a breath after the D at letter \mathbf{D} and nine bars after \mathbf{D} , make sure that the D does not lose its vibrancy and color before the breath, as this will create an unpleasant gap in the phrase. You should be able to take a breath while the sound of the D is still vibrating in the air.
